Minecraft

Minecraft was first released to the public on 17 May 2009, as a developmental release on TIGSource forums, later becoming known as the Classic version. Further milestones dubbed as Survival Test, Indev and Infdev were released between September 2009 and February 2010, although the game saw updates in-between. Mojang has announced on their Twitter that Minecraft will shut down their servers on December 21st, 2020. Minecraft became a smash hit and took over Fortnite in half a month in popularity.

Roblox

Roblox Corporation was created by David Baszucki and Erik Cassel in 2004 and released in 2006 after several years of testing. Despite being a hugely popular online multiplayer game that was recently used for exposure by Stranger Things season 3, Roblox is apparently shutting down in March 2020. This news has naturally resulted in the game's community flipping out over the possibility of no longer being able to enjoy the game,

Cool math games

Coolmath Games first went online in 1997. The site only hosts games that they believe are non-violent and educational. In November 2019, the concern about Cool Math Games being shut on February 16, 2020, is caused by the fact that Adobe is discontinuing their support for Flash in that year. Rather than waiting to be shut down, Cool Math Games has instead started making the transition from Flash to newer formats such as HTML5.

Pokemon global link

The online battling hub for 3DS Pokemon games is ending February. After nine years, the Pokemon Global Link is shutting down, The Pokemon Company has announced. In a statement on the Pokemon Global Link website, The Pokemon Company revealed the service will cease on February 24, 2020.
